Sir/Madam,

I am directed to say that rolling out of Aahaar programme in all 30 districts is under progress. As a quality assurance measure, Senior Officers of this Department will visit all districts shortly for assessment of **a)** infrastructure created under Aahaar programme & the preparedness for rolling out phase II and Phase III Aahaar programme **b)** identifying gaps, if any, in the outlet & kitchen infrastructures and procurement of vehicles wherever applicable & its retrofitting & branding.

You are therefore requested to make assessment study at your level of the infrastructure, preparedness and take corrective measures without delay. The assessment, gap identification and corrective measures will also be taken up for the 1st Phase of Aahaar programme which was rolled out from 1st April'2015 i.e., in the 21 outlets at 5 Municipal Corporations. The Collectors & Commissioners of the five Municipal Corporations should ensure that infrastructure available at the outlets in their area meet the bench-mark standards circulated by the department vide Lt. No. **26126/HUD., dtd. 03.10.2015** (copy enclosed for ready reference).

Further, all required support may be extended to the Senior Officers visiting the districts for the above purpose.


Minutes of "AAHAAR" review meeting held on 9th September 2015 under the Chairmanship of Commissioner-cum-Secretary, H & UD Department, Govt. of Odisha.

Members present-Annexed

A review of "AAHAAR" initiative was taken by Commissioner-cum-Secretary, H & UD Department in his Conference Hall with all the stakeholders. At the outset the Commissioner-cum-Secretary welcomed all the members and briefed about the agenda of the meeting. He stressed on bench marking the infrastructure availability, standard of service, appliances and machineries, cleanliness and hygiene of the various 'Aahaar' outlets and level of monitoring by the ULBs for smooth operation of the AAHAAR initiative. After a detailed discussion the following decisions were made.

1. The basic minimum facilities indicated in the presentation(copy enclosed) to be strictly adhered to by the implementing NGOs and Municipal Corporations.
2. All the corporations will strive to achieve highest level of standard in providing infrastructures, appliances and equipments.
(Action- All Municipal Corporations and NGOs)
3. A letter to be sent to CMD, IDCO indicating the additional funding support required per quarter for smooth functioning of the AAHAAR outlets in Sambalpur.
(Action- H & UD Department)
4. For smooth management of AAHAAR outlets a bilateral agreement may be signed between implementing FNGOs and Municipal Corporation for Berhampur, Rourkela and Sambalpur
(Action- BeMC, RMC, SMC)
5. Proposal for mini AAHAAR outlets if any to be submitted by Cuttack and Berhampur.
(Action- BeMC, CMC)
6. One Nodal Officer to be nominated for each AAHAAR outlets by concerned Municipal Corporation and the same to be intimated to the Department.
(Action- All Municipal Corporation)
7. Model By-law & memorandum to be prepared for formation of AAHAAR Society.
(Action- H & D Department)

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair and all members.

CHECK LIST FOR AAHAR OUTLETS

A	Infrastructure Service
1	Ramp with slope of 1: 8 ratio to access
2	Separate ticket counter for male and female with roof covering to benefit the beneficiaries in queue Stainless steel or concrete unit with granite top as serving counters with two separate tops, one for keeping food container at a height not more than 2' and other one for beneficiaries to keep their plates at a height not more than 3' 6"
4	Dining hall floor with either marble, mosaic or vitrified tiles and wall skirting (tiles) up to 7' Dinning arrangements accommodating at least 100 beneficiaries at a time with minimum 20 dinning platform with seating arrangement specially for beneficiaries belong to old age, physically challenged, patients and children (Calculation of dinning platform including circulation area per person @ 3' X3' =9 sq ft so for 100 person = 900 sq ft)
6	Minimum availability of separate 5 water taps each for male and female as wash basins and the floor area either vitrified tiles, mosaic or marble and tiles fitted in walls of the wash basins
7	Wash basins has to be with flowing water, soap (bar or liquid) and water absorbing mats on the base to soak water/ synthetic mats to give dry base
8	Waste water from wash basin and washing of the establishment to be collected in a soak pit or discharged to a surface drain after treatment

B	Appliances and machineries
1	Dish washer with AMC
2	Water purifier installed inside the dining hall with AMC that includes replacement of filter as recommended by the manufacturer
3	Adequate number of fans and lights at dining hall (Calculation of number of fans @ 1 per 100 sq ft.)
4	Rodent catcher or Insect Electrocuting Device (IED) to make the establishment proof against access by pests such as rodents and flies
5	CC TV surveillance
C	Cleaning and hygiene maintenance
1	Dining space, serving counters, wash basin, taps, drinking water space, container washing place or sink are cleaned and disinfected using a sanitizer daily
2	Mopping of dining floor, dining tables, floor near wash basin, drinking water place on regular intervals during the food serving period to keep it clean and dry
3	Reusable cloths that are used for cleaning are cleaned and disinfected after use
4	Waste has been removed from bins and cleaned each day before closing the outlet and dried upside down
5	Staffs wear clean dress, standardised prescribed aprons , head caps, face masks and hand gloves while serving
D	Monitoring by ULB
1	Carry out regular checks (at least once in a week) to outlets
2	Review the implementation and service delivery (monthly)
3	Water sample collection and testing done periodically (weekly)
4	To get the meals tested by the food inspector regularly (weekly)
5	Ensure maintenance of suggestions and Inspection book at each outlet

Sub: Trial Run of 2nd & 3rd phase Aahaar Programme.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to request you to commence the trial run in 81 outlets as intimated earlier in consultation with your Implementing Partner at least 3 days before the actual launching i.e., 14th April'2016 and should continue till inauguration of the outlets. For trial run the following points may be ensured.

1. The trial run should start in a lower scale may be 100 meals every day and the Nos. of meals may be increased subsequently as per need.
2. No publicity should be given to this. However, a small Display Board should be fixed at Aahaar Outlets mentioning
(i) it is trial run, (ii) Only 100 meals will be served and (iii) the timing is 11.00 A.M. to 12.00 Noon.
3. Deployment of Security Guard during trial run wherever necessary.
4. Since this is to basically understand teething problems, Senior Officers to remain present in the outlets to take note of operational issues & sort out the same.
5. Immediately handover the vehicles & other utensils to the implementing partners, so that, the trial run can be started in time and run smoothly.

This may be treated as **Extremely Urgent**.

RESOLUTION

Sub: Formation of Odisha State Aahaar Society (OSAS) and District Aahaar Society (DAS).

The "Aahaar" initiative of State Government was launched from 1st April'2015 with the objective of providing cooked hot meals (steamed rice and dalma) to the poor and needy people at an affordable cost at the places of public congregation in the urban areas of Odisha.

2. After careful consideration, the State Government have been pleased to decide, for formation of State Aahaar Society at State Level and District Aahaar Society at District Level, in order to make the Aahaar initiative self-sustainable, expand the initiative to other Urban Local Bodies, increase more outlets in the existing ULBs and mobilization of sufficient fund through various sources.

3. The basic objective for formation of Odisha State Aahaar Society (OSAS) shall be (i) to give strategic guidance to District Aahaar Society (DAS) in planning, managing and monitoring the Aahaar initiatives in the urban areas of the State. (ii) to mobilize funds from corporate houses, philanthropic donors, voluntary organizations, individuals, dovetailing of funds or benefits from other Govt. programmes. (iii) to support DAS financially for needy ULBs basing on requirement and assessment, (iv) technically support district in implementing the Aahaar initiatives with benchmarking of the service level standards in the Aahaar outlets in the ULBs etc. Similarly, the basic objective of District Aahaar Society shall be to properly plan and manage Aahaar initiatives in the Urban areas of the District and to mobilize funds for the said purpose.

4. This has been concurred in UoR No.1743/CM dated.02.11.2015.

ORDER: It is ordered that, the Resolution be published in an Extra Ordinary issue of the Odisha Gazette for general information and copies forwarded to all Department of Government/ all Heads of Department/ All District Magistrates/ All ULBs for information.



Introduction

India is home to 194.6 million undernourished people, the highest in the world, as per the *State of the Food and Agriculture Report 2015* by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations. Around the world, one in nine people continue to suffer from hunger. A hungry body does not get strength to initiate action, a hungry mind fails to think, a hungry child loses the childhood. The problem of hunger is not a shortage of food; rather, the undernourished who needs food the most fails to access it. Fighting hunger and poverty has emerged as a prime global concern; the first Millennium Development Goal, 2015 spoke of the need for the eradication of poverty and hunger. Similarly first two Sustainable Development Goals drawn by UN in 2016 speak of 'No poverty and Zero hunger' by 2030. Eradication of hunger and poverty require protective social measures by the state, including provisioning for easy access to food for the deprived. Political will and commitment for inclusive growth has given filip to many subsidised food security programs across the world. Aahaar program initiative of Shri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha in urban areas of the State is to support the most vulnerable people in order to get freedom from hunger.

Aahaar Program Initiative in Odisha

Aahaar is an initiative for subsidised meal to the poor and needy in the urban areas. The program was launched on 1st April 2015 on the auspicious day of Utkal Divas by Shri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha. The program was piloted in five Municipal Corporations – Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Berhampur, Sambalpur and Rourkela- of Odisha with 21 Aahaar centres. The objective of the program is to provide cooked hot meals -steamed rice and *dalma*- to the poor and needy people at Rs 5 /-. After the successful implementation of piloted program, after completing first anniversary, the program was expanded to cover all 30 districts in 73 towns. Hon'ble Chief Minister dedicated 100 Aahaar centres on 14th April 2016 to the people of Odisha. Currently 110 centres are operational in Odisha. Housing and Urban Development Department is the nodal department to implement Aahaar program in the State.

Program Features

Beneficiaries get a meal at Aahaar centres at Rs 5 /- . The Centres function from 11 am to 3 pm each day, except on Sunday. Though the actual cost of the food is Rs. 20/-, the remaining cost of a meal i.e. Rs. 15 /- is being met through support from corporates, local donation, charity, Chief Ministers Relief Fund, etc. Providing good quality food, maintaining hygiene, cleanliness and providing best inclusive infrastructure to cater to the need of aged, differently abled, women, children, sick etc. are the major features of the program.

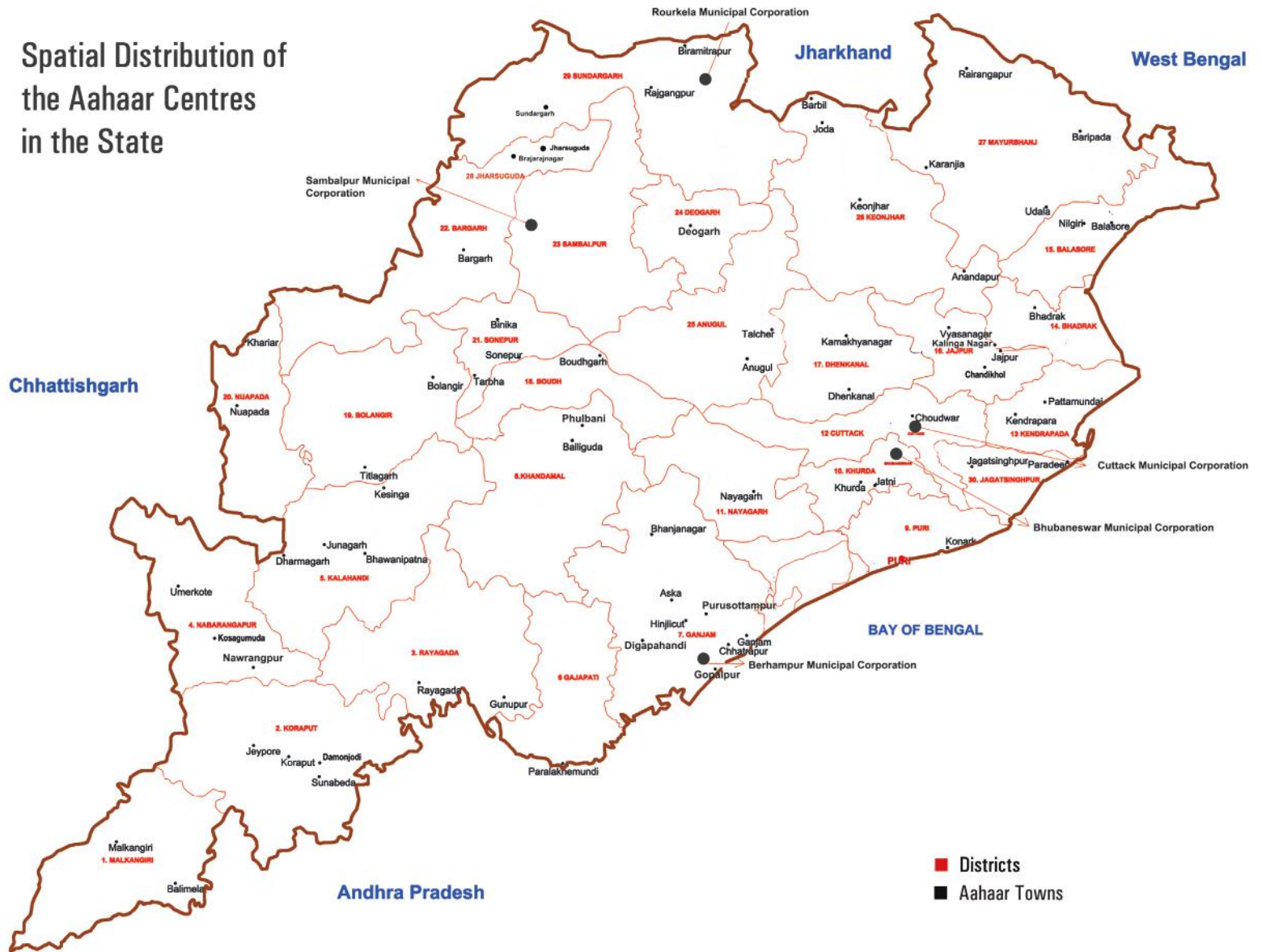

Balasore

Cuttack

Cuttack is one of the piloted cities of Aahaar program. There are eight centres in the district of which Cuttack city has seven centres and one in Chowdwar Municipality. The Millennium city Cuttack is a hub of health care in eastern India. Four major established health institutions such as SCB Medical College, Sishu Bhawan (Paediatrics hospital), Acharya Harihara Cancer Institute, City hospital are situated in the City. Aahaar program benefits the patients and attendants of also poor people coming from across the state and even neighbouring states. Aahaar centre at Malgodam the largest whole sale commodity market mostly caters to the need of labourers working in godown, trolley rickshaw pullers and labourers. Badambadi Bus-stand benefits commuters, rickshaw pullers, porter, bus cleaners, etc. Jagatpur centre mainly feed daily labourers, construction workers, and unskilled industrial workers of Jagatpur Industrial areas.

Centre at Gandhi Chowk is located in central point of the town. Biju Patnaik Market Complex adjoins the centre. A big daily vegetable market operates near the centre at NH 42 and, therefore farmers visiting Chowdwar to sell their products and Industrial workers and street vendors come to Aahaar centre. Food is supplied from the centralised kitchen at Bamphakuda, Cuttack.

Dhenkanal

Jajpur

Jajpur district is fast emerging as major Industrial hub of Odisha. Villagers commute to urban areas for trading of agricultural products and to work in the construction sites in Jajpur, Kalinganagar, Vyasaganar towns. Aahaar centres have become a place of assured meal for such agricultural labourers, farmers, construction workers, industrial workers, etc. The district has four Aahaar centres that cover both the Municipalities of Jajpur town and Vyasaganar, two others are located in Kalinganagar and Chandikhol. District Headquarter Centre in Jajpur town caters to the need of patients and their attendants, rickshaw pullers, etc. One of the unique features of the centre is the involvement of few philanthropic people in feeding mentally retarded persons from the Aahaar centre on regular basis. Center at Vyasaganar Municipality near the Railway station serves the need of villagers who throng to the town as industrial workers, labourers, railway siding workers, porters, etc. Aahaar centre in Kalinganagar Industrial Area is located at Duburi and serves unskilled Industrial workers of Kalinganagar. Chandikhol is at the crossing point of Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur, Jajpur, Keonjhar and Cuttack districts. The Aahaar centre at Chandikhol Bus-stand, targets to meet different categories of people who cross by this busy crossing.

Jharsuguda

Nuapada

Nuapada has two Aahaar centres one at District Headquarter Hospital and other near Khariar Bus-stand. Hospital centre is in a walking distance from the Collectorate and other offices. Beneficiaries include mostly patients, attendant, daily labourers, poor villagers from Boden, Sinapali, Khariar blocks who visit towns for works. *Chakutia Bhunjia* primitive tribal groups who come from Sunabeda sanctuary especially for work at Chakutia Bhunjia Development Agencies also visit Aahaar centre frequently. Khairia centre at New Bus-stand serves the commuters, daily labourers, etc. Both in Nuapada and Khariar, there are two kitchens attached to Aahaar centres.

Nawrangpur

Aahaar program is being implemented in both the ULBs of the district: Nawrangpur, Umerkote Municipality and the third one operates in the Koshagumuda hospital. Aahaar Centres in Nawrangpur Municipality is located adjacent to District Headquarter Hospital and Umarkote centre in DNK hospital. Court, Nawrangpur College and other Government offices are situated near to DHH centre. Umerkote Aahaar Centre is in the premise of DNK hospital and Pendarani College, Assistant Director Agriculture office, etc. are situated within 200 meter radius of the centre and Bus-stand within 500 meter. Koshagumuda Aahaar centre is in the Community Health Centre and block office is near the centre. All three Aahaar centres are based in the hospital so they benefits the attendants, patients as well as labourers, street vendors, local college students. There are two Aahaar kitchens one at Nawrangpur, other one at Umerkote. Food to Koshagumuda centre is supplied from the Nawrangpur kitchen.

Puri

Two Aahhar centres at the Grand Road Puri Town are serving food mostly for the benefit of the needy locals and countless pilgrims who throng to the holy city. Two Aahaar centres in Puri Grand Road, one at District Headquarter Hospital and the other at Bus-stand near *Gundicha* temple are ready to serve poor pilgrims in this *Ratha Yatra*. The *Arkakshetra* Konark has its centre in the premise of the newly built hospital. The centres cater to the stomach of hungry street vendors, beggars, poor pilgrims visiting *Srikshetra*, daily labours, workers of malls, shops, patients, their attendants etc. Food is supplied from the centralised kitchen at Grand Road, Puri.

Rayagada

Rayagada has two Aahaar centres, one near District Headquarter Hospital and the other at Gunupur Bus-stand. Rayagada Aahaar centre is located in a centralised place which is approachable from hospital, new Bus-stand, Court, and other Government offices. Vijayawada Ranchi Corridor (NH 326) passes 100 meters away from the centre. The beneficiaries include mostly patients, attendants, transport workers, daily labourers of the locality as well as labourers from Parbatipuram district of Andhra Pradesh, commuters specially from Kashipur, Tikiri, Kolanara as well as Dongaria Kandha and others from Kalyansighpur. Gunupur Bus-stand Aahaar centre is located near a vegetable daily market and around 500 meter from sub-divisional hospital and Court. Beneficiaries are mostly daily labourers, commuters from Padmapur, Gunupur, Gudari blocks, visiting Gunupur for treatment, attend to court matters, construction labourers and farmers especially Lanjia Saura tribes for selling vegetables, fruits and other forest produces in the local market. Kitchens are adjacent to Rayagada and Gunupur centres.

Sonepur

Sonepur district has three Aahaar centres; Sonepur centre is located at Khadalpada Chowk, about 400 meter from District Headquarter Hospital, 200 meter from Court and the Government offices. The Aahaar centre at Binika is near old Bus-stand, and the Tarva centre is adjacent to various offices and the market place. Beneficiaries in all three centres are mostly labourers, commuters from villages, street vendors and other needy people. At Tarva, local vegetable vendors as well as farmers coming for selling their produces also avail the facility of Aahaar centre. Food is supplied from the centralised Aahaar kitchen at Sonepur. All three Urban Local Bodies therefore have been covered under the program.

Sundargarh

Rourkela is one of the piloted cities of Aahaar program. There are nine centres operational in the district. Six centres at Rourkela and one each at Rajgangpur, Biramitrapur and Sundargarh Municipality. New Bus-stand centre is also near to the Railway station, beneficiaries visiting the centre are mostly commuters, students and Industrial workers. Centre at power house is close to Rourkela Steel Plant gate. The centre serves transportation workers, industrial workers, street vendors, etc. Near the Aahaar centre of Rourkela Government Hospital, a daily vegetable market -Munda market- operates. So the centre attends the requirement of outdoor patients, their attendants as well the farmers coming to the Munda market for selling their produce. The centre at Vedvyas serves the Pilgrims who throngs to the holy place of Vedvyas, other beneficiaries are industrial workers, students and street vendors, etc. Aahaar centre at DHH, Sundargarh and Rajgangpur centre serves mostly patients, attendants and other needy locals. Beneficiaries of the Bus-stand centre of Biramitrapur are mostly commuters, street vendors, etc. Food to the centres at Rourkela, Biramitrapur and Rajgangpur are supplied from the centralised kitchen at Sector 7, Rourkela and food to the Sundargarh hospital centre is supplied from the centralised kitchen of Jharsuguda.

Sambalpur

Sambalpur is one of the piloted cities of Aahaar program. There are five Aahaar centres operational in the Sambalpur Municipal Corporation. VSS Medical College and Hospital, Burla caters to the health needs of western Odisha, part of Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand. The centre serves 1800 meals everyday and this centre serves the maximum number of beneficiaries per day in the State. The beneficiaries are mostly patients, their attendants and sanitation workers engaged in cleaning of the hospital. Similarly District Headquarter hospital serves patients and their attendants. Centre at Laxmi Takis is in front of OSRTC Bus-stand. Golbazar, the biggest market of Sambalpur City is in a stone throw distance from the centre. Beneficiaries of this centre are mostly street vendors, support staffs of shops, malls, poor college students staying in mess and other commuters. Centre at Horticulture office is within a kilometre from the Railway station. Beneficiaries include porters, construction workers, etc. Jail Chowk centre is located in 100 meter radius of Collectorate, Tahasil office, RTO office, Court, etc. So the centre benefits mostly the commuters from villages coming to the city for office work and to attend court, street vendors, etc. The food is supplied from the centralised kitchen near women's college, Bhutapada at Sambalpur.

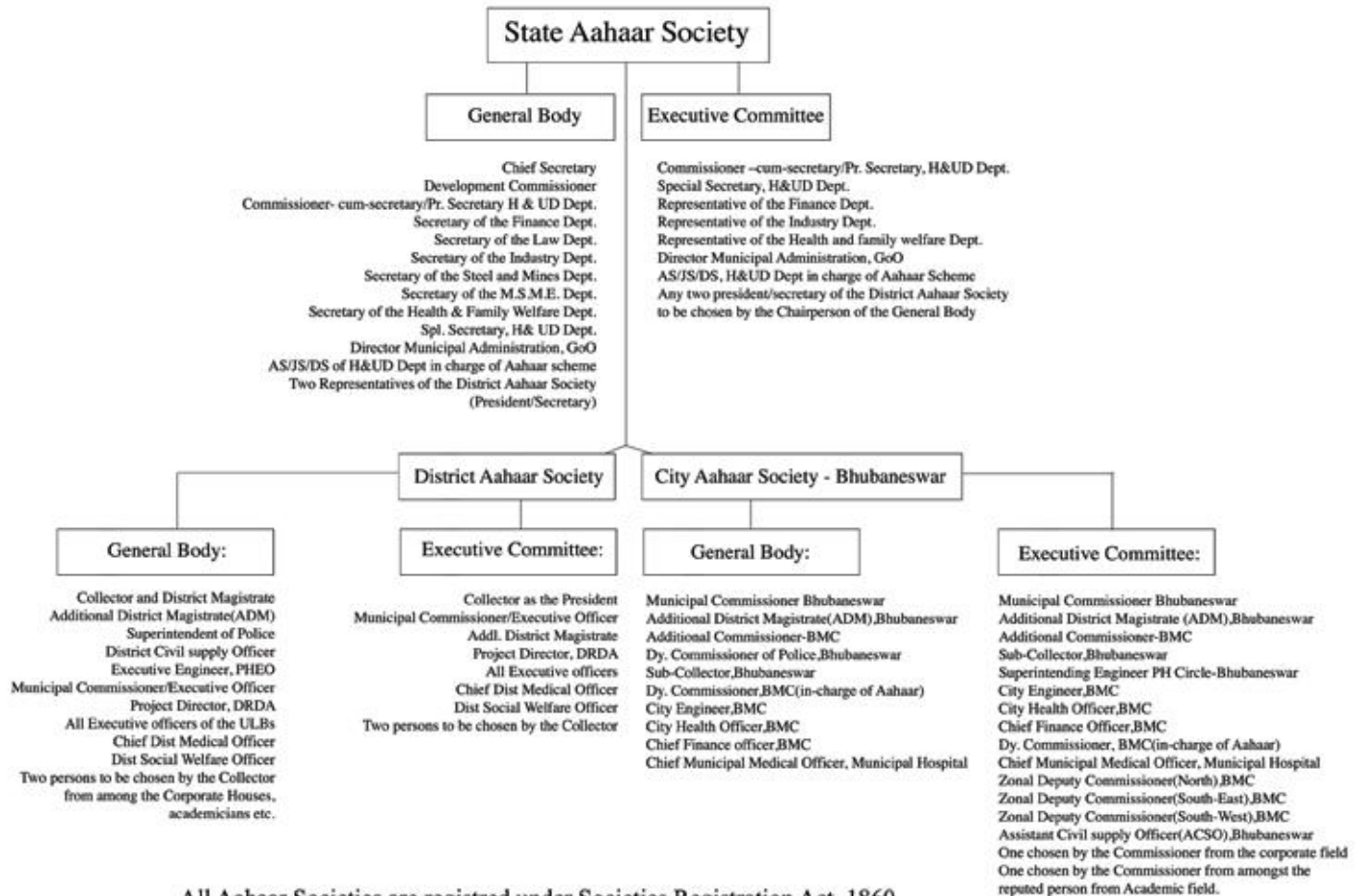

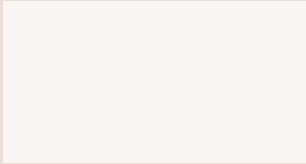

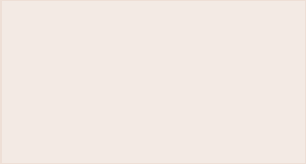
Aahaar Program Implementation Structure
