







- People's participation in governance not a new concept

- 73rd and 74th Constitutional Amendments to nurture citizen participation in the public policy process



A mass movement spearheaded by the LDF Government in 1997



Examples: Porto Alegre, Brazil

- Citizen-led, Government-supported initiative
- Not just morally right, but economically sound: \$ 700 million of Infrastructure spending, with Budget Surplus in 7 years
- Central plank for Political Party, with enormous electoral success: 4 consecutive local victories, increasing regional presence, recent NATIONAL VICTORY (Oct 2002)
- "Porto Alegre a way of Government, not just a way of Budgeting" – World Social Forum, Jan 2001



"Until 5-6 years ago, we had been <u>imposing</u> <u>bureacratic ideas in city administration, to no effect</u>. So we have turned that process around, 180 degrees.

We now come from the premise that <u>most citizens</u> want to be involved in governance

If you start from that, <u>the question becomes, 'How</u> <u>do we do this?' rather than 'Should we do this?'</u>"

•The Burning Issue for the BMP

• Raising Resources: Consistent shortfall of 30% - 50%

The Solution

• Plenty of revenue opportunities that can be enhanced: Property tax, Building licences, Advertising, Parking etc.

The Problem with the Solution

• Requires citizens and other stakeholders to voluntarily participate

•The Credibility Gap

• Citizens are convinced that government management of money has many weaknesses
